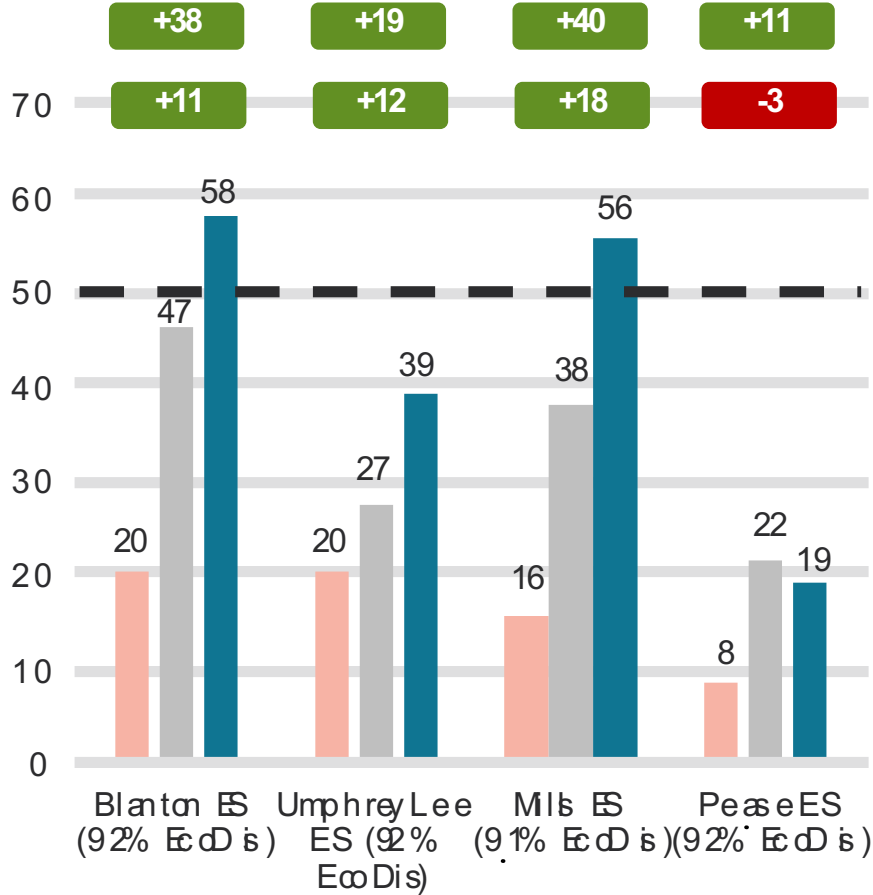

ACE 1.0 Elementary Schools (Year 3)

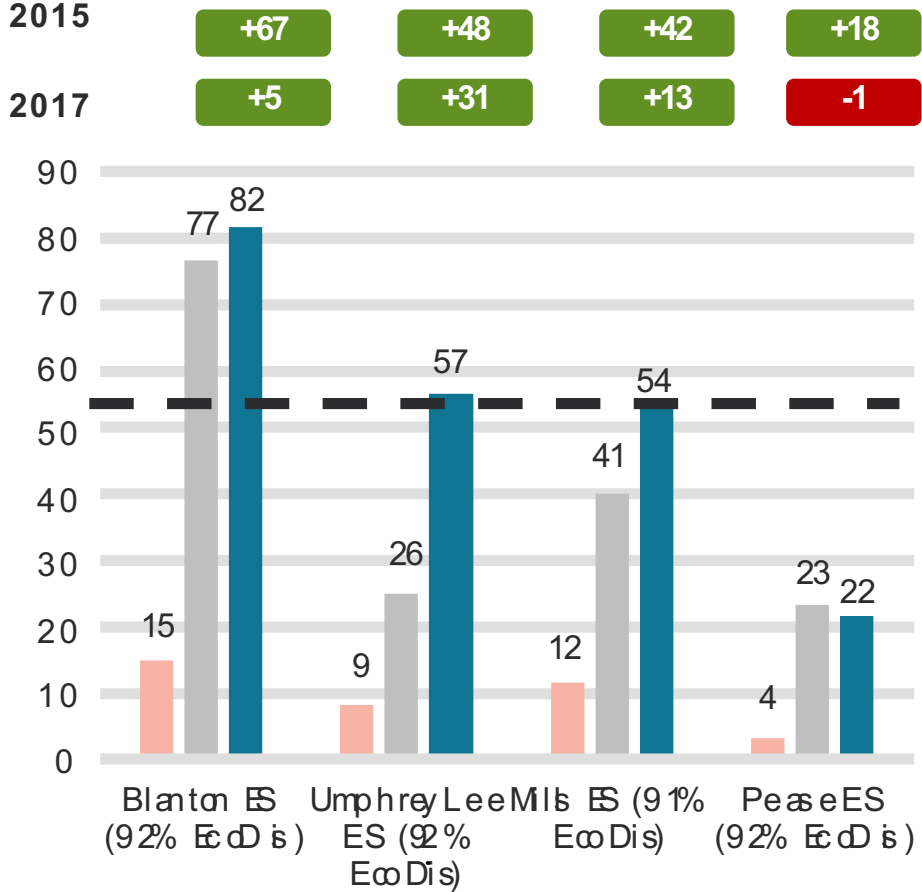
Percentage of Students at Meets Standard – 5th Grade Reading

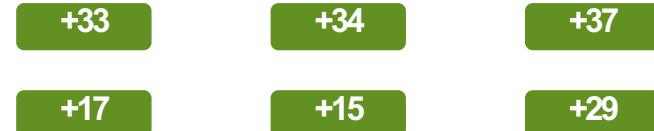
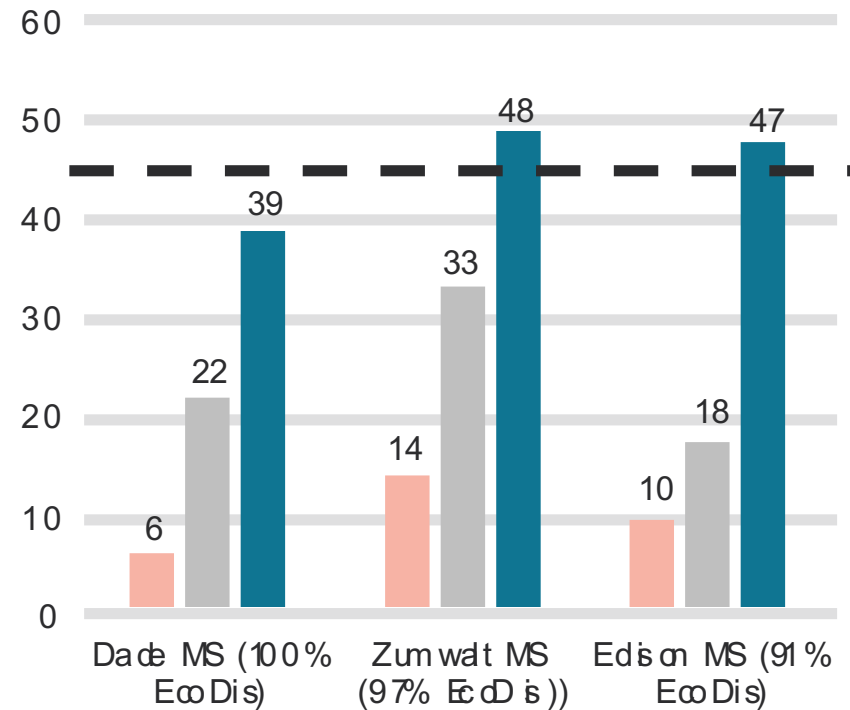
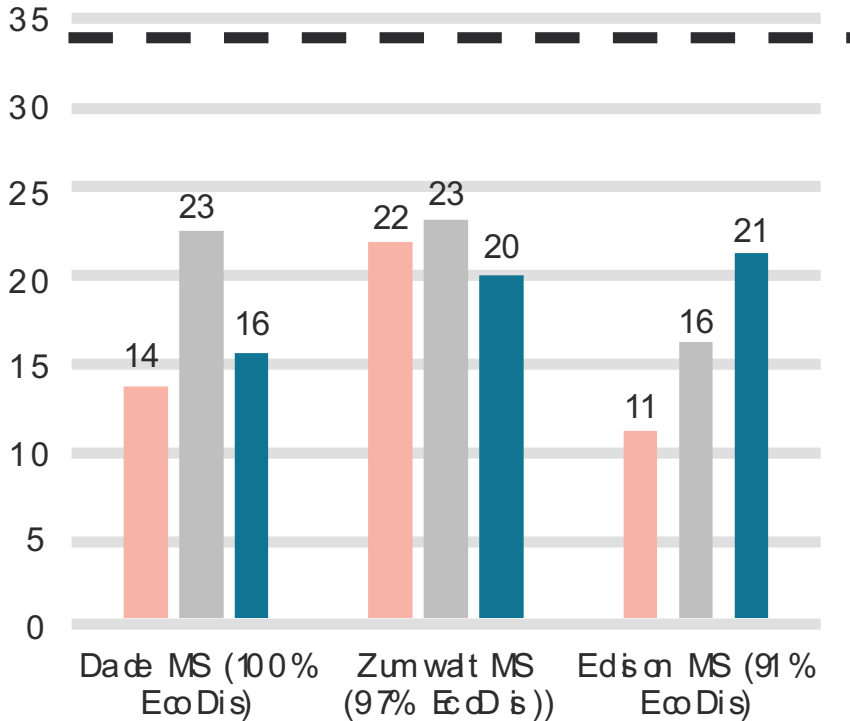
Percentage of Students at Meets Standard – 8th Grade Reading

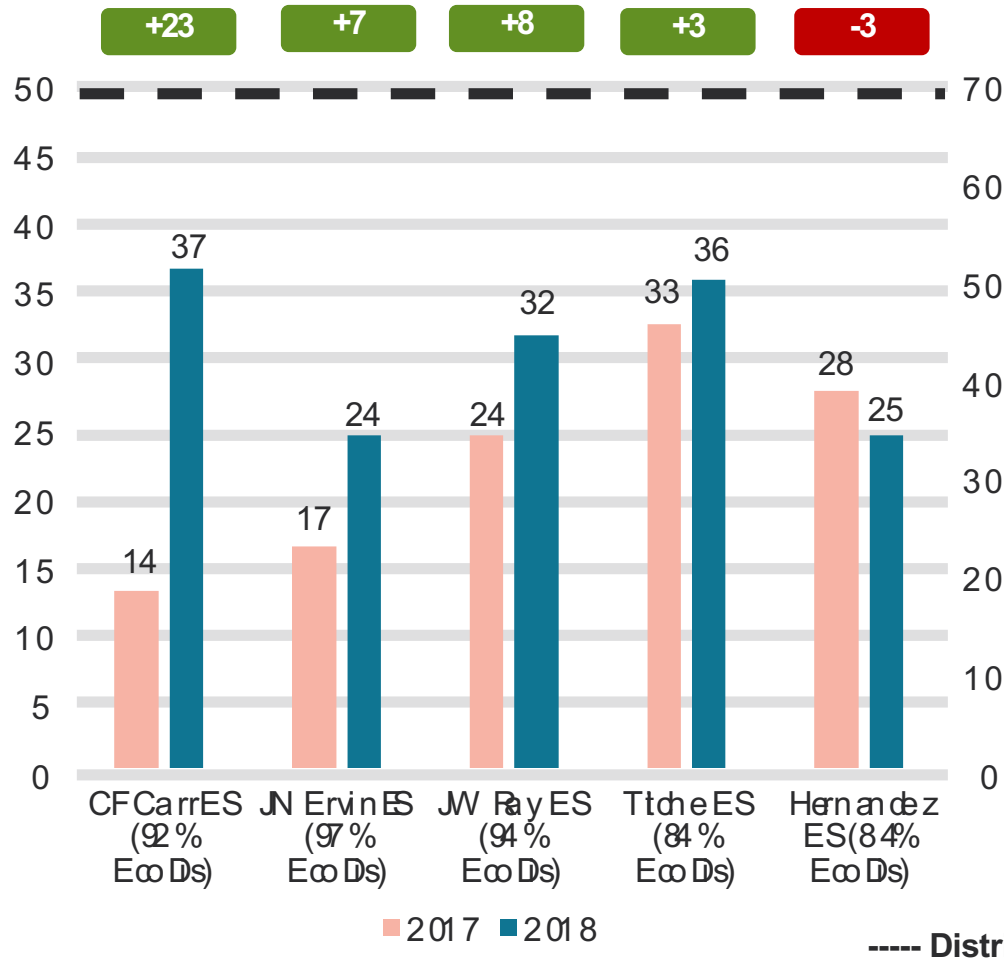

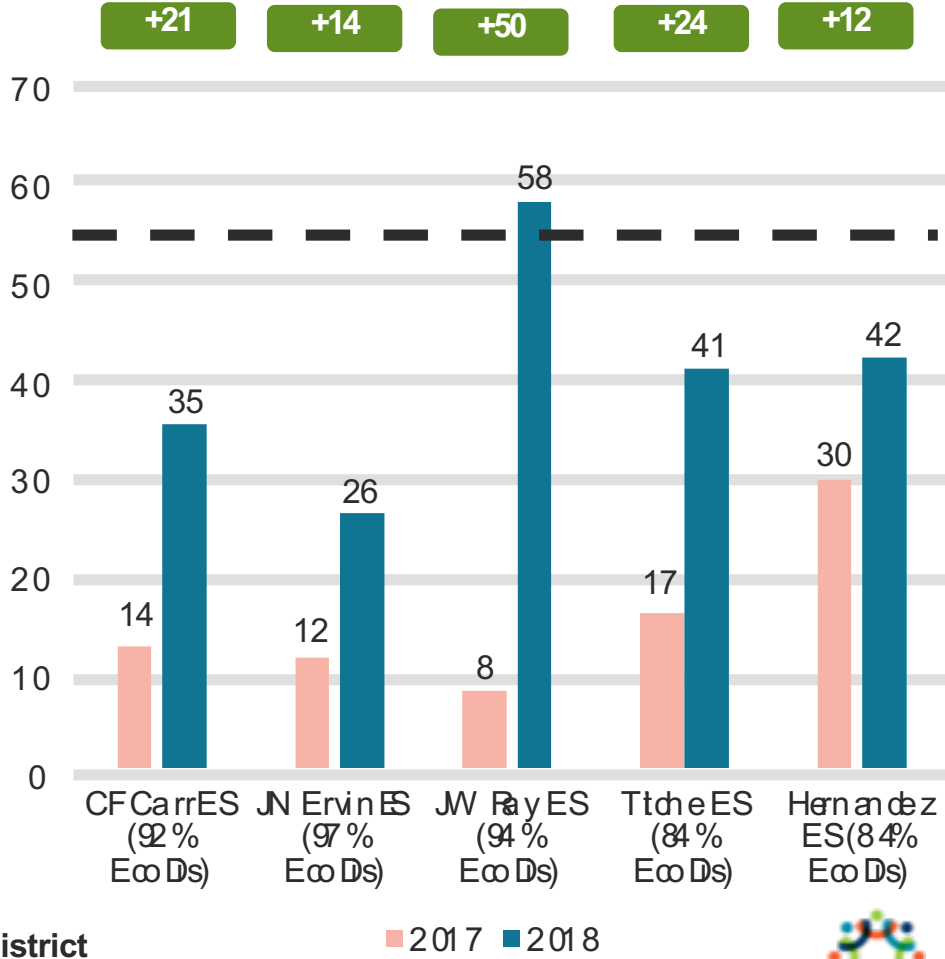


ACE 2.0 Elementary Schools (Year 1)

– 5th Grade Reading

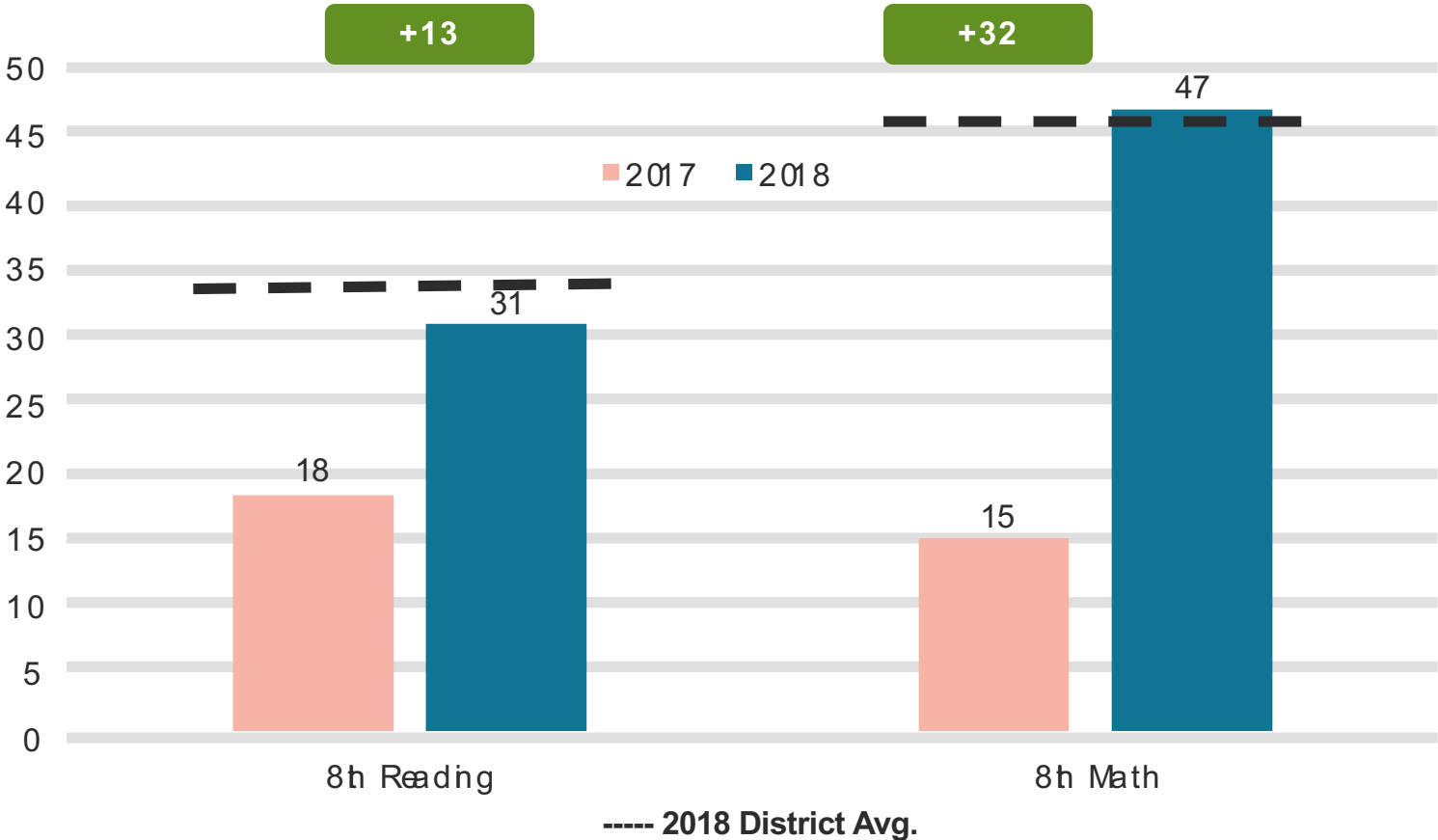


Percentage of Students at Meets Standard

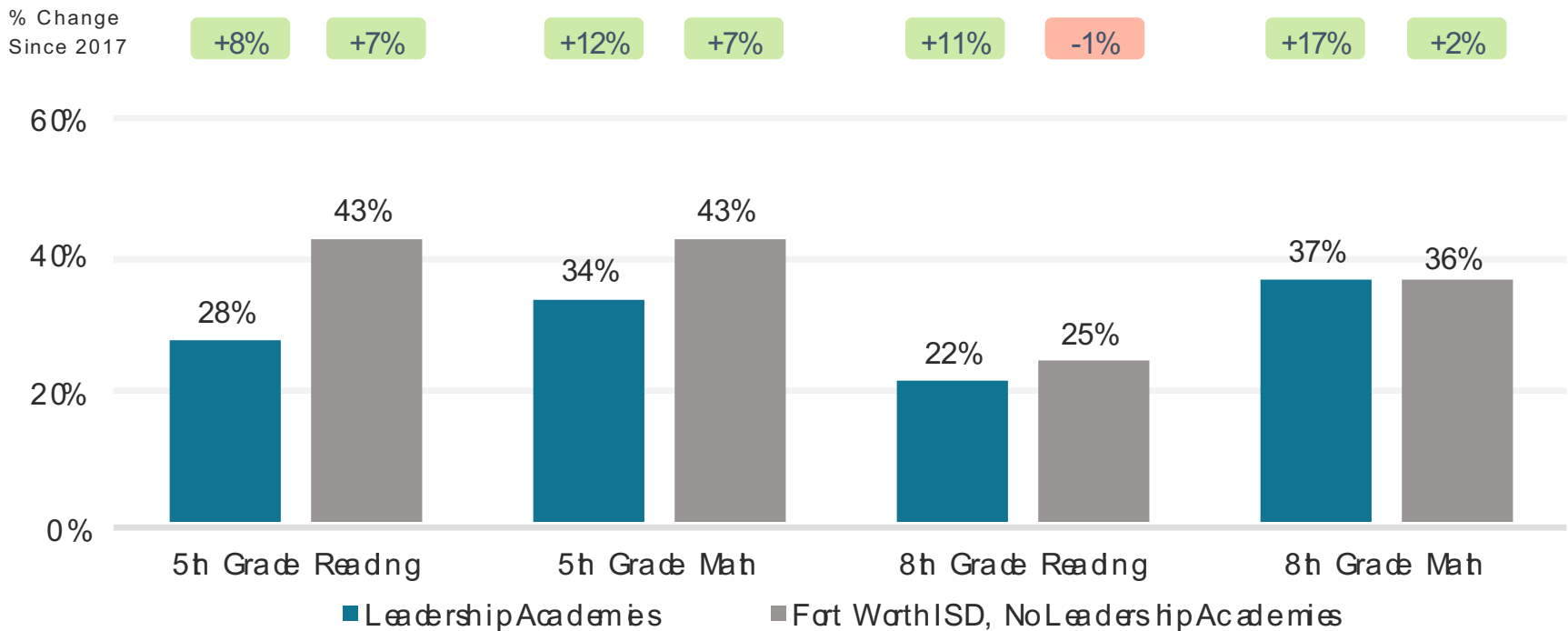

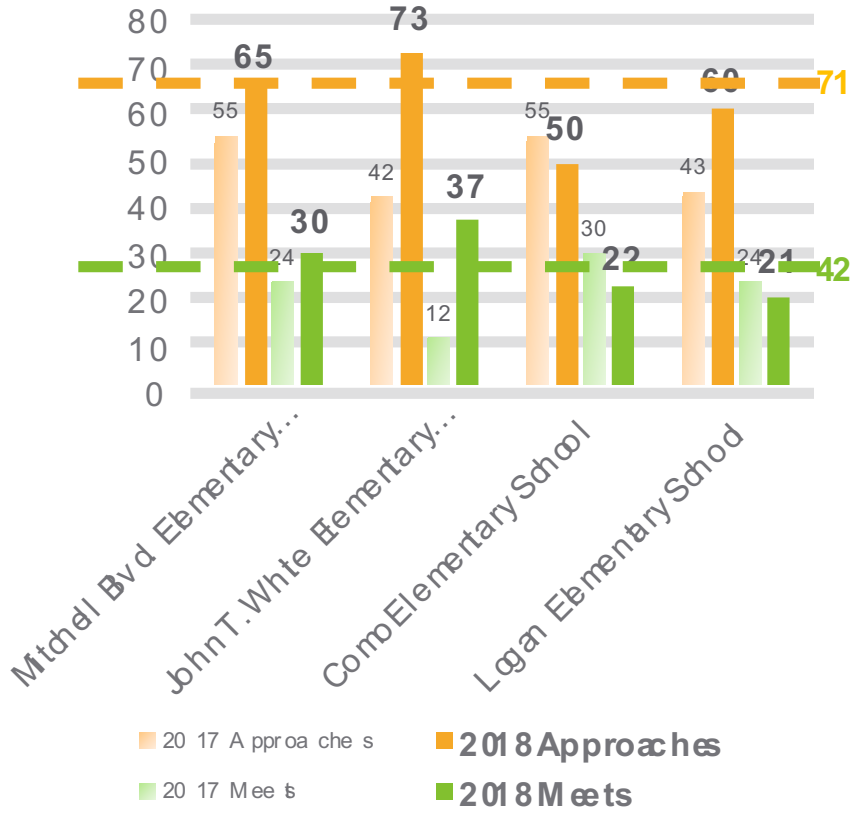

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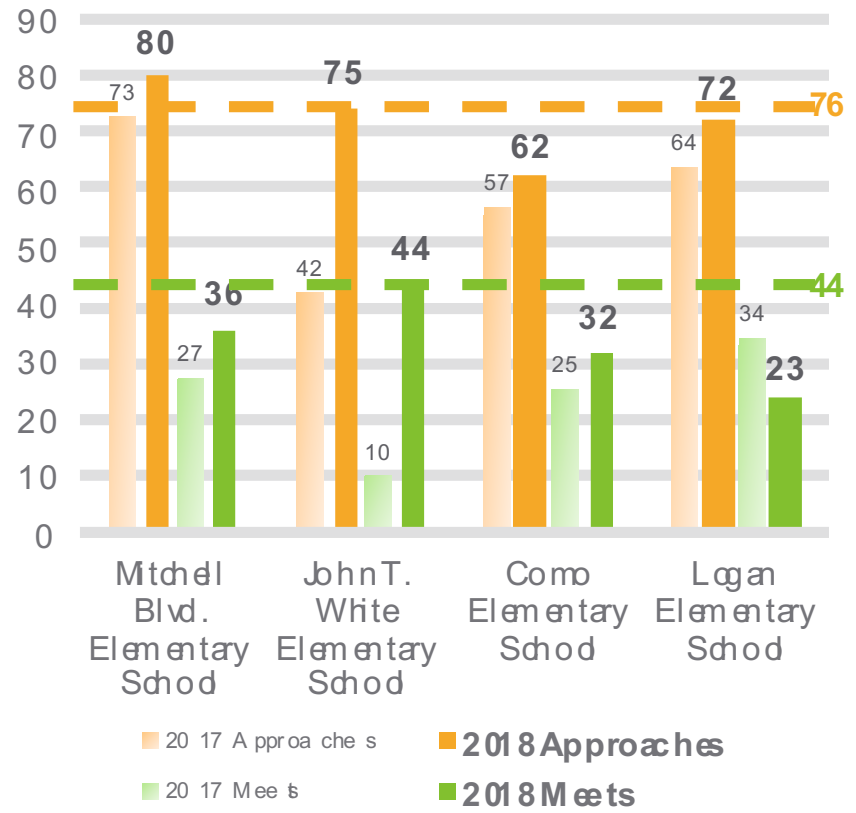

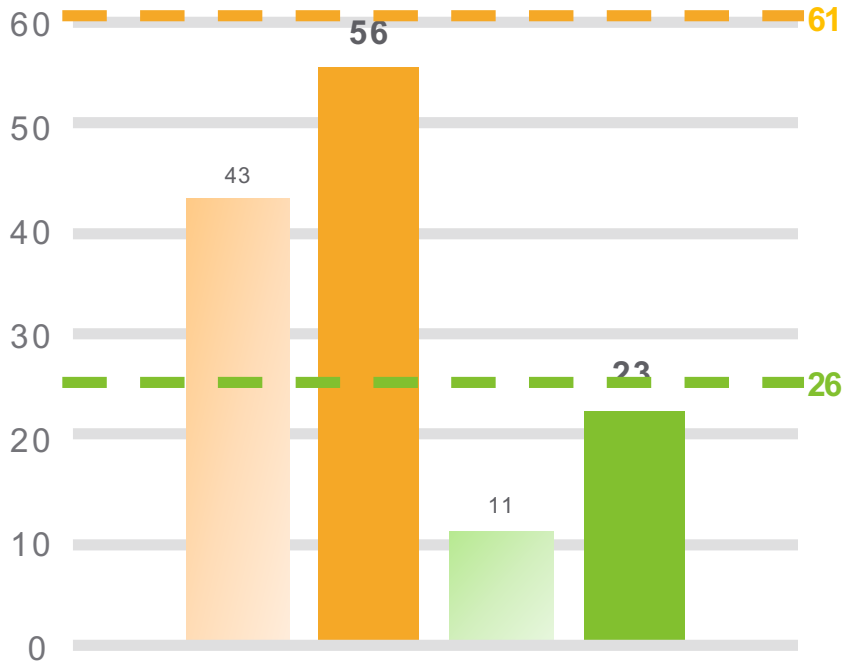

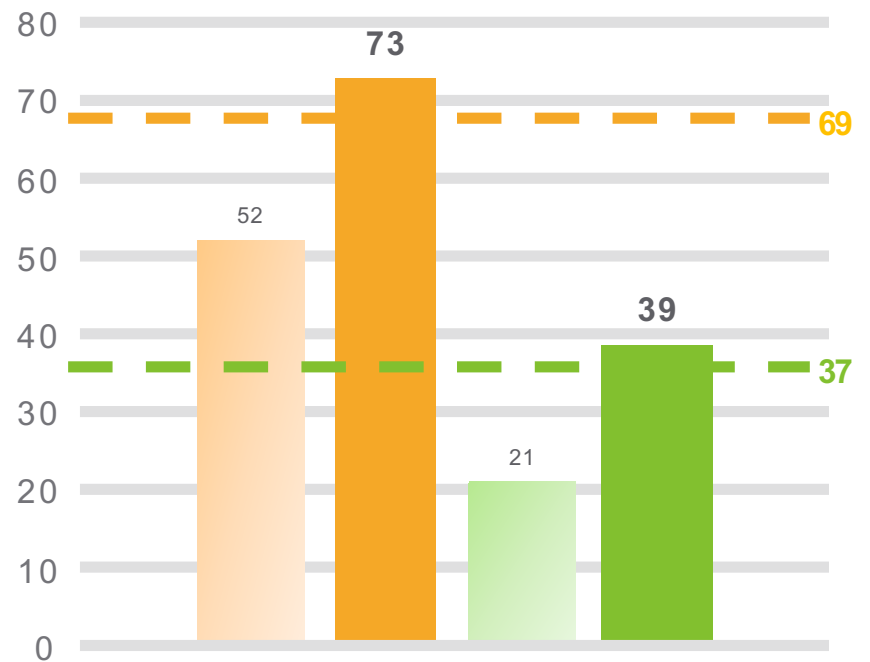

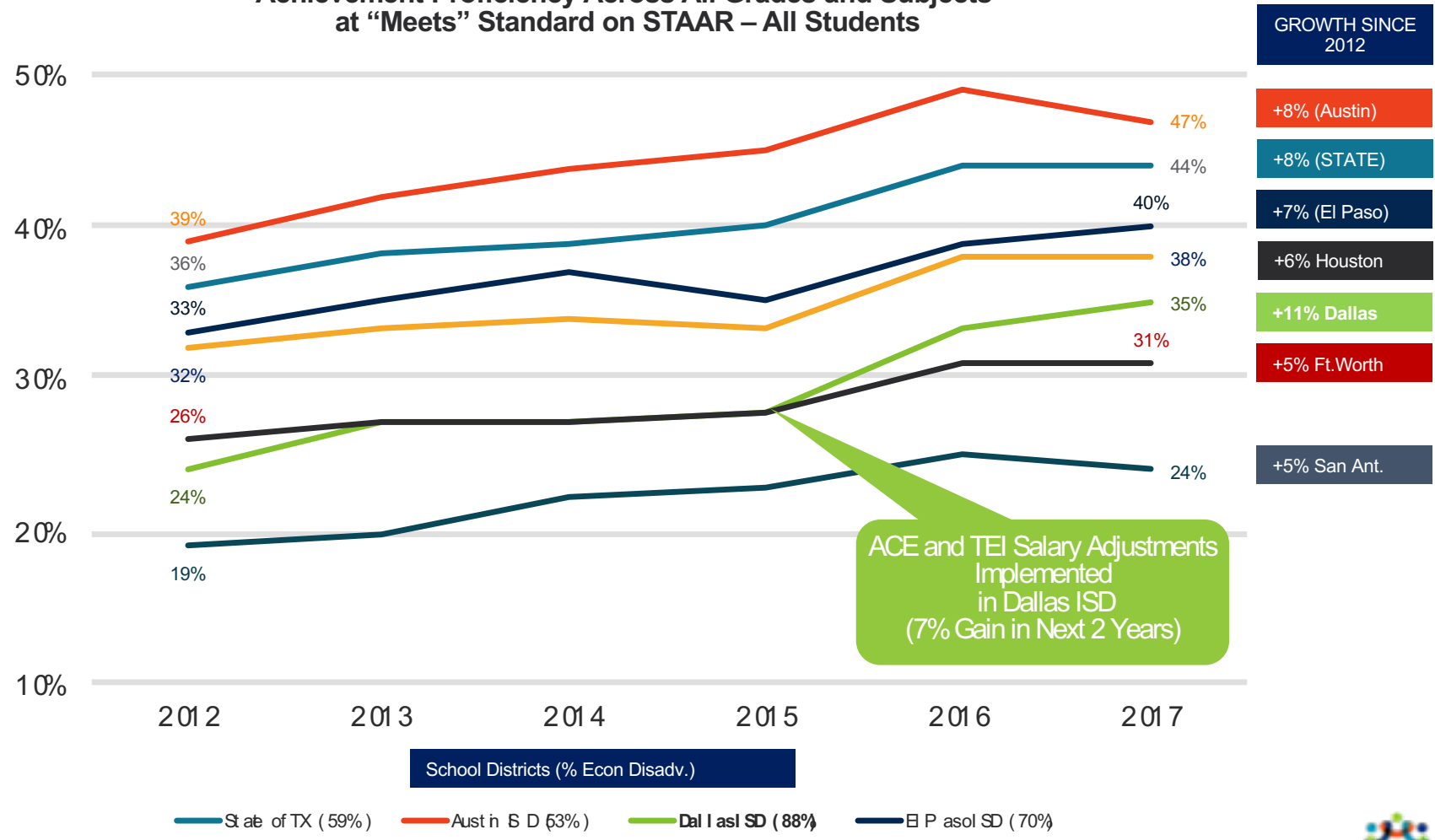
